Celebrate the diversity of our channel! In a typical week, Channel 2 features programs in Spanish, Bosnian, and English; programs about travel, religion, the African American community, the aged and their caregivers; psychics, lawyers, elected officials, and fitness instructors. We are community empowerment at its best.

How do we empower? You might be interested to know that during 2006, our six Canon video cameras were checked out an average of 228 days *each*. Obviously, there were few days when the cameras sat idle. There was a total of 2,289 equipment and facility reservations, which a reasonable person would have to admit require a ton of data and backup paperwork. But the real story is what our mountain of data enables: information in a native language, entertainment, health tips, fitness programs, Pennsylvania legislative news, military news, pro wrestling, arts presentations, locally produced movies, advocacy for important causes, and many others. Channel 2 is the local voice that is missing on commercial television. How else would all this happen? The answer is obvious: without Community Access Television, it wouldn't.

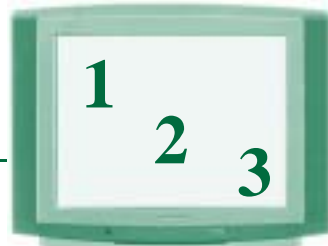
